Dear Mr Marlowe

Raemaekers' agreement with the Daily Mail having expired, he has asked me to tell you that he has made an arrangement for the future publication of his drawings with another paper.

Will you, therefore, kindly see that no more of his drawings appear in the Daily Mail ?

I have been staying with him in Bath and he showed me there a letter from Mr Baker in which the latter asked Raemaekers to come and see him to arrange the price to be paid for the cartoons published since the agreement expired, of which I believe there have been four.

I am not sure that Raemaekers could not regard the publications as continuing the contract - but that would be rather absurd. It would be best that you should pay for them individually at the price of Fifteen Pounds each. Will you give the necessary instructions ?

Personally I am, of course, sorry that he has left the Daily Mail and gone to what is, politically and otherwise, an opposition paper; but there was no alternative.

Please be sure and see that the Daily Mail publishes no more of the drawings -
