You also have in progress negotiations with the Paris Journal. Beyond these, I believe you have no agreements outstanding, and I am to make arrangements for any other publication in Great ~~Br~~ Britain, as also in France, the United States or other countries, whether in periodicals, in albums or other volumes or as separate plates - in fact to do the best I can for you in all directions. Kindly let me know if this is in accordance with your wishes and understanding -
